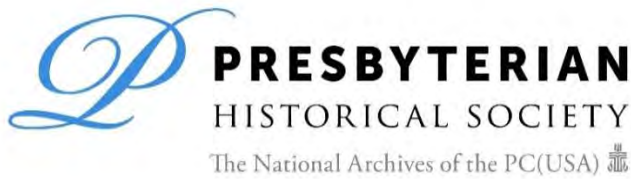


A Picture's Worth
