Justice ROLLS ON

The Women's Crisis Center of Taney County in southwest Missouri, received a Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering Grant in 2000. Read on to learn how they put their grant to good use.

In 2000, the Women's Crisis Center of Taney County received a grant through Presbyterian Women's Birthday Offering. Established in 1990 in southwest Missouri, the Center provides shelter, support and advocacy for victims of domestic violence. Executive Director Becky Vermiere reports that by 1997, it had become obvious that they needed to expand their services to provide support to victims of sexual assault.

In 2000, Becky applied for a Birthday Offering grant to help the Crisis Center build transitional housing. At the time, the area lacked affordable transitional housing. So when people who had experienced domestic violence needed to leave emergency housing, many had nowhere to go but back to abusive situations.

Thanks in part to a \$200,000 grant from PW's Birthday Offering, the Crisis Center now has five transitional cottages (in addition to their 14 emergency shelter cottages). These residences provide shelter for up to 24 months for victims and families, as they work with the court system and social services to gain independence.

Today, the Crisis Center provides quality residential and non-residential services to victims and survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault. It serves both women and men who are caught in abusive domestic situations, providing sexual assault crisis intervention and emergency shelter. Staff members work as advocates for people who have experienced domestic violence, standing with them as they work their way through the courts, support groups and legal assistance. Multilingual interpreters are available. They do all of this work on what Becky calls their "shoe-string budget"—that did not include funding specifically dedicated for victims of sexual assault until 2014.

Last year, the Crisis Center provided emergency shelter (stays of less than 90 days) for 192 women, 2 men and 97 children; non-residential treatment for 252 women, 18 men and 183 children; and transitional housing for 6 women, 1 man and 6 children. Additionally, 433 victims participated in non-residential support groups. Becky lamented that for every one victim aided by the Crisis Center, two victims must be turned away due to limited shelter and funding.

The Center operates with eight staff members and close to 200 volunteers (who provided an incredible 4200 hours of service in 2014). In addition to ongoing funding, Becky said the shelter continues to need items that are found in any home—from food and personal hygiene supplies to clothing and linens, appliances and furniture. She welcomes the support of area Presbyterian Women's groups and cites receiving the Birthday Offering as a huge boost to their ability to serve the women, men and children in the community.

Heartland 180 Overland Park, Kansas

Heartland 180—a new program in the Kansas City, Kansas area—serves boys and girls between the ages of 11 and 17 who have been a part of the criminal justice system. Heartland 180 conducts intensive training sessions on character building, core values and life skills for these at-risk youth. Funds from the Birthday Offering will allow Heartland 180 to purchase a dedicated space and computers that will enable the program to maintain confidential information about participants and donors. These investments will help Heartland 180 continue their important work and increase the number of youth served.



Habitat for Humanity East Bay/Silicon Dalley Oakland, California

Housing costs in the East Bay and Silicon Valley areas of California are among the highest in the country. Manufactured or mobile homes are often the only affordable option for individuals and families with lowincomes, many of whom are elderly or disabled. Nearly two-thirds of the manufactured homes in East Bay and Silicon Valley were built before 1980 and need significant repairs. Your gift to the Birthday Offering will allow Habitat for Humanity to partner with more than 100 individuals and families to repair their manufactured homes, ensuring safety and stability for these households.



Direct Action and Research Training (or DART) Center trains individuals to build powerful local justice ministries. With funds from the Birthday Offering, DART will train clergy and lay leaders in more than 20 communities on how to stop the flow of children into the school-toprison pipeline. High illiteracy rates and zero-tolerance discipline policies within school districts have led to high numbers of youth being suspended or expelled. DART's training will help communities advocate for restorative behavioral practices for these students, facilitating their development and education rather than pushing them into the juvenile or criminal justice systems.





Building Minds in South Sudan Pittsford, New York

Building Minds in South Sudan increases access to education for girls in the Republic of South Sudan. The literacy rate in this country is among the lowest in the world, and the rate for females is significantly lower than for males. Your gift to the Birthday Offering will fund the construction of a girls' primary school, for levels one through eight, in Majok-Keen, a village in Warrap State, South Sudan. With six classrooms, a large multipurpose building and two blocks of latrines, the school will serve approximately 600 girls. Investing in girls' education produces benefits for the girls, their community, their future families and their country.

But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

Meditation

We are a people who long for justice, but it seems so overwhelming. Wages are stagnant, while the cost of housing in many markets is skyrocketing. Children born poor face a life with statistically limited educational opportunities and the increased likelihood of being shuttled into the prison system at younger and younger ages, thanks to no-tolerance school discipline policies. Girls born into agrarian homes in South Sudan find it difficult to gain access to education.

Biblical scholar James Limburg, in his Amos Interpretation commentary, says that the text indicates God is displeased when people worship for its own sake, with no impact on the other days of the week.² Chapter five contains many verses focusing on the negative impact of an unjust economic system.

The witness of the prophets demands that the people advocate on behalf of those who are most vulnerable in society. Over and over again in the Old Testament, we read pleas for justice on behalf of widows, orphans, the poor and immigrants. Here in Amos 5:24, righteousness is not a neat little box of tidy solutions. It is a vigorous body of water, flowing without end.

Justice and righteousness don't march or sit or get written down once on a piece of paper. Justice and righteousness roll, rush, gurgle, surge, sweep away.

If we are to take the witness of the prophets to heart, we hear that it is not just showing up to Sunday services or to our circle meetings, but how we live our faith everyday that matters to God. Presbyterian Women's commitment to living faith in the world means doing the work of justice.

We cannot fix economic injustice with the power of a good thought or a wish, but in response to God's love for us, we can be tireless advocates working for righteousness to flow.

- This year's Birthday Offering supports:
- Critical repairs to manufactured homes for those with extremely limited incomes in the East Bay and Silicon Valley so they are safe
- Growing the capacity to help highrisk youth find alternatives to ongoing involvement with the juvenile justice system in the Kansas City, Kansas, area while improving rates of academic achievement and civic engagement
- Training leaders in 21 Midwestern and Southern communities who will stop the school-to-prison pipeline by organizing for change of school policies
- Increasing access to education for girls in South Sudan by funding the construction of a girls' school in Majok-Keen, a village in Warrap State

Our Birthday Offering gifts are one way we advocate for the most vulnerable in our world today: people with low incomes who need help making their homes safe, youth in the juvenile justice system who need alternatives and support, schoolchildren shuffled from school toward the prison system, and girls too poor and isolated to gain the education they need. These gifts are how we live our faith in response to God's love. We worship on Sunday, and, on the other six days of the week, we advocate, work, give and speak out. May it be so.

Prayer of Dedication

- One: Holy One, tireless advocate on behalf of the most vulnerable, we pray for people seeking safe and secure homes in a place that is increasingly unaffordable. Bless those who are served through Habitat for Humanity East Bay/Silicon Valley.
- Many: May the God of justice hear our prayer.
- One: Loving One, we pray for vulnerable children caught up in the spiral of the prison industrial complex, who will now see a way out thanks to the work of DART, Inc. and Heartland 180, Inc.

- Many: May the God of righteousness hear our prayer.
- One: Joyful One, we pray for girls who will now have the opportunity for an accessible education thanks to Building Minds in South Sudan.
- Many: May the God who calls us to be advocates hear our prayer.
- One: We pray for justice to roll down like waters. Bless our Birthday Offering contributions, and bless the work of those advocates who see the possibility of a world in which your people are housed, educated and freed to their own potential.

Meditación

Somos un pueblo que anhela justicia, pero parece tan abrumador. Los salarios están estancados, mientras que el costo de la vivienda en muchos mercados se está disparando. La niñez que nace en pobreza se enfrenta a una vida con oportunidades educativas estadísticamente limitadas y debido a las políticas de disciplina escolares de la no tolerancia, a un aumento de la probabilidad de ser enviados al sistema penitenciario en las edades más jóvenes. A las niñas nacidas en hogares agrarios en Sudán del Sur se les hace difícil acceder a la educación.

El académico bíblico James Limburg, en su comentario interpretativo Amos, dice que el texto indica que Dios está disgustado cuando las personas adoran para su propio bienestar, sin ningún impacto en los demás días de la semana². El capítulo cinco contiene muchos versículos centrándose en el impacto negativo de un sistema económico injusto.

El testimonio de los profetas exige que las personas aboguen en nombre de quienes son más vulnerables en la sociedad. Una y otra vez leemos en el Antiguo Testamento las peticiones por justicia en nombre de las viudas, huérfanos, los pobres y los inmigrantes. Aquí en Amós 5:24, la justicia no es una cajita reluciente de soluciones ordenadas. Es un vigoroso cuerpo de agua, que fluye sin fin. La justicia y la rectitud no marchan o se sientan o son escritas una vez en un pedazo de papel. La justicia y la rectitud, corren, avanzan, en borbotones, en oleada, arrasan todo.

Si vamos a atesorar el testimonio de los profetas en nuestro corazón, escuchamos que no es sólo aparecer los domingos en los servicios o ir a nuestros círculos de reuniones lo que le importa a Dios, sino cómo vivimos nuestra fe día a día. El compromiso de las mujeres presbiterianas de vivir la fe en el mundo significa hacer el trabajo de la justicia.

No podemos solucionar las injusticias económicas con el poder de un buen pensamiento o un deseo, pero en respuesta al amor de Dios para nosotras, podemos ser defensoras inagotables para que la justicia fluya.

PROMOTING THE BIRTHDAY OFFERING

In your PW group

- Be sure to order the materials you need, including the DVD, bulletin insert, placemats and individual or group offering envelopes (see page 12 for order form).
- Set a goal to challenge the members of your PW group.
- Show the DVD and talk about the offering with each circle.
- Distribute group and/or individual offering envelopes in your circle.
- If you do not have regular gatherings, ask each circle to receive the offering once a year or ask members to make a contribution to the offering in their own birth month.
- Make a presentation at your spring gathering.

In your church

- Consider promoting the Birthday Offering to the entire congregation.
 - Get session approval.
 - Make the Birthday Offering the topic for the Minute for Mission on Celebrate the Gifts of Women Sunday. Ask for everyone's support and ask them to put their gifts in a basket at the back of the sanctuary following the service.
 - Be sure to use the Birthday Offering bulletin cover as the cover of your church bulletin and include the Birthday Offering bulletin inserts.
 - Include an announcement in your church newsletter about the Birthday Offering and how it helps change lives.
 - Display the Birthday Offering poster in a prominent place.
 - Hold a special event at which you receive and dedicate the Birthday Offering (maybe a birthday party!).
 - Use Birthday Offering placemats at an all-church function sometime during the year.
 - Distribute individual and/or group giving offering envelopes to the congregation.



BIRTHDAY AND THANK OFFERING Grant Criteria

Birthday Offering grants primarily fund capital improvement projects, so they are larger and awarded to just one or two agencies per year. Thank Offering grants are smaller so that more projects may be funded. Grants awarded are one-time grants. Although the project does not have to be completed in a single year, the project must be underway within one year of receiving the funds. Grants may not be used for payment of current debt, creating or maintaining revolving loan funds, funding a permanent endowment or to offset the ongoing operating budget. Requests for funds predominantly for salaries will not be given high consideration, nor will applications from organizations previously awarded Birthday or Thank Offering grants.

To qualify, a program must

- have a clearly defined purpose that meets basic human needs and is in accordance with mission goals and policies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.);
- provide a form of aid that has been requested or identified to meet the needs of the people served; and
- be a creative project less than three years old or an existing project moving in a new direction.
- Priority will be given to applicants not previously funded by PW's Creative Ministries Offerings.

A proposal must

- describe how the project will improve the lives of people served and how they will be involved;
- indicate how the project will work with women, children, youth, young adults, persons of diverse races and/or ethnicities, and/or persons with disabilities, to enhance their quality of life;
- list all other sources of money being requested and/ or already awarded for this project; describe how the program will continue after the grant (if awarded) is spent;
- explain how the project's progress will be reported and success measured;
- provide an endorsement from a PW group of a local church, PW in the Presbytery coordinating team or PW in the Synod coordinating team. A letter from the presytery or synod is desirable, but not necessary. If outside the United States, a written endorsement from an indigneous church that is in relationship with the PC(USA) must be provided. Please allow six weeks to obtain an endorsement;

• be signed by the proposal writer and another person responsible for the project (board chair preferred).

Grant applicants must notify PW staff mission specialist Cindy Goodman (cindy.goodman@pcusa.org) of any change in the proposal, whether funding, leadership or location, since submission of the proposal. Notification must be received before August 1 for the Birthday Offering and before February 1 for the Thank Offering.

Grant recipients must return an interim report six months after receiving the first payment and all supporting documentation before the second payment will be made; must return one-year and two-year follow-up reports; and must notify PW if there is any change to the project, its leadership or address.

Proposal submissions (two copies) must include

- application form and proposal form checklist
- endorsement letter from a PW group (U.S.) (presbytery or synod) or a church in relationship with the PC(USA) (international)
- budget for proposal submitted for funding
- applicant agency's operating budget showing current expenses and revenues to date
- agency's latest audited financial statements (Birthday Offering applicants only)
- completed W-9 form (for domestic projects)
- completed W-8 form (for international projects)
- completed Statement of Confirmation of Identity by Third Party (for international projects)
- bank letterhead, if requesting a wire transfer

Send proposals by May 15 (Birthday Offering) or September 15 (Thank Offering) to Presbyterian Women, attn: Cindy Goodman, 100 Witherspoon St., Louisville, KY 40202-1396. Do not use folders or binders and do not attach the cover letter to the applications. Decisions are made in September of the same year (Birthday Offering) and March of the following year (Thank Offering). The first payment is disbursed approximately one year later (Birthday Offering), three months later (Thank Offering); the second is disbursed six to nine months after the first payment.
