Koinonia Farm in Americus, Georgia, received a \$15,000 grant for its project that will allow the bakery manager to train in inventory, budgeting and management. Funding will also be used to provide part-time employment to area residents and will support the ongoing life and work at Koinonia.





United Producers of Valle San Miguel in Valle San Miguel, Panama, received a \$13,381 grant to purchase supplies, equipment and plots of land to increase production of plantains and a variety of vegetables to increase food security for the people involved in the project, and to generate income to sustain production in the long term.

Project Hope for the Homeless in Painesville, Ohio, received a \$1,000 COVID-19 grant from the Western Reserve Presbytery SDOP Committee to assist people seeking shelter. The homelessness problem has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.



The funds will assist in the publication of a newsletter for older adults living in Central Brooklyn. The newsletter helps keep them emotionally connected, builds a sense of community and helps improve their mental state, which was made fragile by the isolation due to COVID-19 that they are experiencing.


