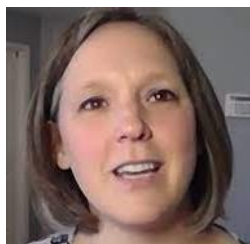

Geneva, Illinois

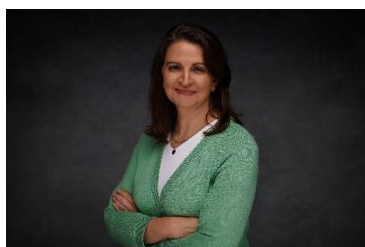
