OPENING SENTENCES

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Living God, you sent Jesus into this world to break down the dividing walls of hostility and establish justice and peace among us through the reconciling work of the cross. Establish a new humanity in Christ. Make us no longer strangers and aliens, but citizens with all your faithful people and members of your holy household,

CONFESSION AND PARDON

The confession and pardon may be led from the baptismal font.

The Lord does not desire sacrifice as an offering for sin; God asks us to show love and mercy, and waits with an open ear to hear our prayer.

Trusting in God's grace, let us confess our sin.

O Lord our God,

you have made each person in your own image—your holy handiwork, crowned with beauty.

Yet we have denied your image in others. We have allowed our prejudice to obscure our vision of our neighbors. We have built up oppressive systems that mistreat the many and favor the few. We have remained silent and safe while others have suffered so much.

Forgive us, God of grace.
Set us free from the sin of structural racism, strengthen us to dismantle dividing walls, and help us to build a home of hope for all; through Jesus Christ, our Sovereign and Savior.

Tell the glad news of deliverance in the great congregation: the steadfast love and faithfulness of the Lord are everlasting.

I declare to you, in the name of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven. **Thanks be to God.**

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

The prayer for illumination is led from the lectern or pulpit.

O Lord our God, teach us by your Word and send us your Spirit that we may follow in the way of Jesus Christ our Savior, **Amen.**

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

We trust in God, whom Jesus called Abba, Father.

A Brief Statement of Faith (excerpt), Book of Confessions, 11.3

In sovereign love God created the world good and makes everyone equally in God's image, of every race and people, to live as one community.

But we rebel against God; we hide from our Creator. Ignoring God's commandments, we violate the image of God in others and ourselves, accept lies as truth, exploit neighbor and nature, and threaten death to the planet entrusted to our care. We deserve God's condemnation.

Yet God acts with justice and mercy to redeem creation. In everlasting love, the God of Abraham and Sarah chose a covenant people to bless all families of the earth.

Hearing their cry, God delivered the children of Israel from the house of bondage.

Loving us still, God makes us heirs with Christ of the covenant.

Like a mother who will not forsake her nursing child, like a father who runs to welcome the prodigal home, God is faithful still.

INVITATION TO DISCIPLESHIP

The invitation to discipleship may be led from the baptismal font.

Even before you were born the Lord God called and claimed you as a witness to all the peoples of the earth—lifting up those who are bowed down, showing honor to those who are rejected, and giving dignity to those who are despised.

How will you use your gifts in God's service? How will you share in the church's work of dismantling structural racism and building the beloved community? Come and join us in joyful service to the Lord. See Isa. 49

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

The prayers of intercession may be led from the midst of the congregation.

Baptized by John in the Jordan, Jesus was anointed by the Holy Spirit to bring good news to those who are oppressed. As those who share in Christ's baptism we open our hearts to God's saving work, saying: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

For the church ...

that it may become a living sign of the beloved community you desire. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For the world ...

that leaders may work to establish justice and neighbors and nations may live in peace. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer**.

For creation ...

that the earth may be protected from harm and all people share freely in its gifts. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

For our neighbors ...

that our communities may be safe places for all to flourish, grow, and thrive. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

For loved ones ...

that the sick may find relief from suffering and the sorrowful be comforted. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

O Lord our God, teach us to follow Jesus faithfully that we too might "come and see" the vision of your righteous realm. Transform these prayers into action that all people may receive the promise of abundant life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

INVITATION TO OFFERING

The invitation to offering may be led from the Communion table.

We give thanks to God always for the grace we have received in Jesus Christ.

God has enriched us with knowledge and speech that we might renounce the power of evil and bear witness to the grace and truth of Christ.

Let us be good stewards of these spiritual gifts by speaking up against structural racism, standing up with all who are oppressed, and offering up our lives in service to others.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

The prayer of thanksgiving may be led from the Communion table.

God of all grace and peace, we give you thanks for the abundant gifts of your Spirit and the witness of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Strengthen us to live according to your way—offering welcome to strangers, justice to the oppressed, liberation to those who are captive, and sanctuary to those who are persecuted. Keep us faithful in your service while we work, watch, and pray for the coming of your holy realm; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

The blessing and charge may be led from the doors of the church.
