The Center provides necessary conditions for rehabilitation, education, activity and social adaptation to further contribute towards improvement of the social-economic state of the children and their families.</p> <p><b>The Youth Business Armenia project</b> is aimed at supporting young people in the regions of Armenia in their need for entrepreneurial success, and to contribute to the creation and expansion of youth-led enterprises, thus promoting development of the local private sector and helping to alleviate the poverty and social disparities.</p> <p><b>Sevanavank</b> is a monastic complex located on a peninsula at the northwestern shore of Lake Sevan in the Gegharkunik Province of Armenia, not far from the town of Sevan. According to an inscription in one of the churches, the monastery of Sevanavank was founded in 874 AD by Princess Mariam, the daughter of Ashot I (who became a king a decade later).</p> <p><b>Noratus cemetery</b>, also spelled Noraduz, is a medieval cemetery with many early khachkars located in the village of Noratus, Gegharkunik Province near Gavar and Lake Sevan. The oldest khachkars in the cemetery date back to the late 10th century.</p>
<b>Day 3</b>	<b>8:00-9:00 am</b> Breakfast  Khor Virap (in case of the clear sky)  <b>10:00 am</b> Visit to <b>Garni Pagan temple</b>	<p><b>Khor Virap</b> (1-hour drive from Yerevan) is a place of pilgrimage for Armenians all over the world, where Armenian pagan king Trdat imprisoned Saint Gregory the Illuminator for refusing to acknowledge the Goddess Anahit. From here one can enjoy the majestic view of Mount Ararat.</p>

It is the only example of the Hellenistic culture in the territory of the whole Caucasus. The fortress is situated in a picturesque mountain locality and commands a broad panorama of orchards, fields and mountain slopes covered with motley carpets of varicolored grasses, of the jagged and precipitous canyon of the Azat river.</p> <p>The Monastery of <b>Geghard</b> (the Lance) is located 40 km southeast of the city of Yerevan in the mountainous region of Kotayk. Inscriptive and documentary references to the monastery, also known as Ayrivanq, date from the 7th and 10th centuries, respectively. It is famous for its rock-carved chapel of St. Astvatsatsin.</p> <p><b>Vernissage</b> (walking distance from the city center) is an open-air market of local handicraft jewelries, carpets, art work, carved wood ornaments, etc.</p>

The earliest settlement dates back 2500 years and is known as the center of traditional Armenian architecture, science, and tourism. The inhabitants have gained the reputation of hospitality and a rich sense of humor.</p> <p><b>The Youth Engaged in Society project</b> is aimed at fostering democracy and developing active and responsible citizens through the establishment of debate clubs in Armenia. The project began in 2005 and has been active in more than 100 schools of Armenian regions.</p>

<b>Day 5</b>	<p><b>8:00-9:00 am Breakfast</b></p> <p><b>9:00 am</b> Noravanq Monastery (1-hour drive)</p> <p><b>12:00 pm Lunch in Noravanq</b></p> <p>Visit to <a href="#">Tatev Monastery, Wings of Tatev cableway</a> (optional)</p> <p>Dinner on the way back to Yerevan</p>	<p><b>Noravanq Monastery</b> (1.5-hour drive from Yerevan), situated on a ledge over Arpa River gorge surrounded by fantastic red rocks, was founded in the place of an ancient monastery and took on special significance as a cultural and religious center in the 13-14<sup>th</sup> centuries. On the territory of the complex there are several khachkars (cross stones) of original design the most valuable of which is a khachkar by Momik dating to 1308 AD.</p> <p><b>Tatev Monastery</b> is a masterpiece of confluence of ingenious medieval architecture and fabulous natural beauty of Armenia. It is one of the most spectacular attractions and famous spiritual and education centers of the Middle Ages.</p> <p><b>Wings of Tatev</b> is the longest reversible aerial tramway (3.5 miles) that holds the record for Longest non-stop double track cable car.</p>

It holds the history of Armenian and foreign nations' written cultures.</p> <p><b>Yerevan</b> is the capital of Armenia situated on the Hrazdan River, north-east of the Ararat plain. The population of Yerevan is estimated to be about one million people. The history of Yerevan dates back to the 8th century BC. Yerevan is a city of Christian cathedrals, theatres and museums, universities and academies, parks and research labs, squares and industrial sites.</p>

It is located in the north of the country, bordering Georgia.</p> <p><b>Vanadzor</b> is the capital city of the Lori region. It is the 3-rd largest city in Armenia and the industrial, economic, educational and cultural center of Lori. The city is about 120 kilometers (75 miles) north of the capital Yerevan. Vanadzor was known as Gharakilisa, then in the Soviet period as Kirovakan, and after the independence of Armenia in 1992, Kirovakan was renamed Vanadzor.</p> <p>The city is located in the valley of the Pambak river, 1350 meters above sea level, surrounded by the mountains of Bazum and Pambak. The word Vanadzor is a combination of two words meaning "Valley of Van", Van refers to the historic Armenian city of Van (now in the territory of</p>

The area of the present-day Vanadzor has been settled since the Bronze Age, which is proved by the tombs and other historical remains found on the hills of Tagavoranist and Mashtots. The area was a part of the Tashir of Gugark; which was the 13th province of the Kingdom of Armenia.</p>

It is the seat of the Catholicos of All Armenians and the most populous city in Armavir province, about 20 km west of Yerevan. The original cathedral was founded in 301 and is one of the first churches in the Christian world.</p> <p><b><i>Yerevan Wine Days</i></b> is an event during which you can travel through the rich flavors and traditions of Armenian wine. The most important objective of the Wine Day is to present the eternal history of Armenian wine-making to the world, not only in Armenia but also in the development of festive tourism in the region. By 2023, the festival had 120,000 visitors, of which about 30,000 were tourists.</p>
