Mr. Rogers Day Resources

Fred Rogers was an ordained minister of word and sacrament for the PC(USA) and is a notable public figure whose work around peace and reconciliation as well as neighborliness and kindness are worth remembering. Rogers was also a pioneer in the world of Christian education and formation of young children. <u>March 20th</u> was his birthday and the day that the PC(USA) has chosen to highlight all we can learn from his work.  Office of Theology and Worship based on Ephesians 6:15 with suggestions on how to celebrate Mr.
 Rogers as well.
- <u>Jesus, Teach Us to be Neighbors</u> This is a NEW hymn commissioned by the Office of Theology and Worship. The text was written by David Gambrell and melody and accompaniment by Wil Smith. <u>Here</u> is the hymn with chords. This may be helpful to share in worship virtually or to teach others hymn. <u>Here</u> is a recording of children singing it.
- Mr, Rogers Coloring Page –This reproducible original artwork is based on Ephesians 6:15 and features the text "As shoes for you feet, put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace." inside Mr. Rogers sweater. His shoes and neighborhood are also present. Designed especially for Mr. Rogers Day by the folks at <u>Illustrated Ministry</u>, the artwork can be downloadable in a variety of sizes 8.5×11, 11×17, 24×36 and 36×48 in black/white. It is also available in <u>color</u> in all the sizes.

• <u>Building a Neighborhood Together: An Intergenerational Peacemaking Project from Family Communications</u>—Producer of "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood". This free downloadable booklet describes the process for building a neighborhood out of boxes and other everyday household supplies. It is an activity for all ages and all kinds of families working together. The Neighborhood Build is based on Fred Rogers' ideas about relationships, creative play, pride in making things, family communication, and community.

- Peacemaking in the Family by Mr. Rogers—Four Intergenerational Events for Your Church, by Fred Rogers and Barbara Marsh This free downloadable adaptable resource, developed in 1984, is both timeless and timely, coauthored by Rev. Fred Rogers. This resource is organized around four areas of family life feelings, growth, hard times and celebrations and identifies peacemaking skills that can be employed to strengthen all members of a household. For each topic there is helpful background information and an intergenerational program design. It is based on the book Mr. Rogers Talks with Parents, written by Fred Rogers and Barry Head. Even though it is over 30 years old, the lessons held in this resource and the inspiration of Fred Rogers are as relevant and important today as they were when first written.
- <u>Peace Fair</u> This is an intergenerational event which is a part of the Season of Peace materials from the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program.
