

A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood Mr. Rogers Emphasis Day – 15 Things to Do

Fred Rogers was an ordained minister of word and sacrament for the PC(USA) and is a notable public figure whose work around peace and reconciliation are worth remembering. Rogers was also a pioneer in the world of Christian education and formation of young children. March 20th was his birthday and the day that the PC(USA) has chosen to highlight all we can learn from his work. Here are 15 ideas for faith communities to engage in this emphasis day.

- 1. Ask everyone to wear a sweater to worship or your event in person or online. (post/share photos.)
- 2. Sing "Won't You Be My Neighbor" in worship or at the beginning of your class or event.
- 3. Watch Mister Rogers' Neighborhood clips as part of your worship service or education class.
- 4. Plan an adult education class using the documentary, the movie or one of the books about Mister Rogers.
- 5. Engage in Neighboring Sunday using suggestions from this Neighboring Sunday QuickSheet
- 6. Lead a children's sermon about "being yourself".
- 7. Mr. Rogers was ordained to the ministry of his TV show. Recognize and learn about those in your Presbytery that are ordained to serve in ministries other than a local church pastor.
- 8. Plan an intergenerational worship service using the Walking in God's Path of Peace Intergenerational Worship Quicksheet based on Ephesians 6:15. Learn the newly composed hymn Jesus, Teach us to Be Neighbors.
- 9. Learn about and support organizations that engage in early childhood education.
- 10. Ask your youth/young people to lead Storytime and conversation for children with
 - Who Is My Neighbor? by Amy-Jill Levine & Sandy Eisenberg Sasso and illus. Denise Turu Blues and Yellows just don't mix, and that's how it's always been—until the day Midnight Blue takes a tumble along the road and a Yellow named Lemon stops to help him .  - Or choose one of the other books listed below.
 - Or listen to and discuss Mr. Rogers songs.
- 11. Make plans to use Mister Rogers Intergenerational Curriculum based on Mr Rogers' Neighborhood. This is a free downloadable 4 session curriculum. http://www.pcusastore.com/misterrogers
- 12. Give families a set of Peace Cards for quick at home faith practice. See ideas on how to use them in this
- 13. Share these virtual backgrounds from PBS Kids for your virtual Sunday School or Worship experiences.
- 14. Share one of the videos of Flyaway books being read by the author or an educator. Walking toward Peace: The True Story of a Brave Woman or Three Lines in a Circle: The Exciting Life of the Peace Symbol.
- 15. Add books to your library around themes of peace and reconciliation, neighborliness, and kindness.
