# **Immigration and Crime**

The myth that there is a correlation between high immigration rates and increased crime

My God sent his angel and shut the lions' mouths so that they would not hurt me, because I was found blameless before him; and also before you, O king, I have done no wrong. Daniel 6:22

#### Information:

Across the country calls are being made to limit immigration and deport undocumented immigrants based on the erroneous belief that there is a correlation between high levels of immigration and crime. Although, research consistently reveals immigrants are less likely than native-born citizens to commit crimes, the misperception continues. The National Opinion Research Center's 2000 General Social Survey, asked whether respondents believed "more immigrants cause higher crime rates" and 73% believed that immigration is causally related to more crime.

Some groups exploit the fear of increased crime in pushing agendas to limit immigration. This is used to justify the many state and local immigration related ordinances and laws, detention of immigrants, and increased spending on border security. At all levels of the immigration debate crime and immigration are conflated and portrayed as if there is a positive correlation.

### Insight:

In reality immigration rates are at their highest yet crime is at some of the lowest levels seen. In fact, since the early 1990s while immigration quadrupled, crime rates have declined both nationally and in cities and regions of high immigrant concentration. Immigrant populations doubled from 1994 to 2004 and the violent crime rates declined by 35.1% and property crime rates fell by 25.0%. While crimes rates have declined, incarceration rates have sharply risen.

per 100,000 people. Between 1980 and 2006, the rate grew to 751 per 100,000.<sup>3</sup> The vast majority of the over 2 million people in jail are men between ages 18-39. Of those prisoners, the incarceration rate of US born was five times the rate of the foreign-born.<sup>4</sup>

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

The causes of crime are complex and involve a host of factors. However, a higher predictor of crime is ethnicity and educational level, not immigration status. The risk of imprisonment for male high school dropouts is 6.9% compared to high school dropouts, 2%. It follows that increasing the support of education, especially for minority males, would lower their risk of incarceration.

#### Invitation to act

Be aware of the immigration debate in the local community and oppose rhetoric which characterizes immigrants as the root of violence and crime in neighborhoods.

Recognize and provide the space for immigrants to share their work in the local community through educational opportunities, forums, and workshops.
