15 The eyes of all wait upon **you**, O Lord, *
and you give them their food **in** due season.

16 You open **wide** your hand *
and satisfy the needs of every **living** creature. **R**

17 **O Lord, you are righteous in all your ways *
and loving in all your works.**

18 O Lord, you are near to those who **call** upon you, *
to all who call **upon** you faithfully.

19 **You fulfill the desire of those who fear you; *
you hear their cry and help them.**

20 O Lord, you preserve all **those** who love you, *
but you destroy **all** the wicked.

21 **My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord; *
let all flesh bless your holy name forever and ever. **R****

and in that day **their** thoughts perish. **R**

5 Happy are they who have the God of Jacob **for** their help! *
whose hope is in the **Lord** their God;

6 who made heaven and earth, the seas, and all **that** is in them; *
who keeps **faith** forever;

7 who gives justice to those who **are** oppressed, *
and food to **those** who hunger. **R**

The Lord sets the prisoners free;

8 the Lord opens the eyes **of** the blind; *
the Lord lifts up those who **are** bowed down;
the Lord loves the righteous

9 and cares **for** the stranger; *

and gathers the exiles of Israel.

3 The Lord heals the brokenhearted *
and binds up their wounds.

4 **The Lord counts the number of the stars ***
and calls them all by their names.

5 Great is our Lord and mighty in power, *
whose wisdom is beyond limit.

6 **The Lord lifts up the lowly, ***
but casts the wicked to the ground. R

7 Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; *
make music to our God upon the harp.

8 **God covers the heavens with clouds ***
and prepares rain for the earth;

God makes grass to grow upon the mountains *
and green plants to serve humankind.

14 God has established peace **on** your borders *
and satisfies you with the **finest** wheat. **R**

15 **God's command is sent out to the earth, *
and the word of the Lord runs very swiftly.**

16 God gives **snow** like wool *
and scatters **hoarfrost** like ashes.

17 **God scatters hail like bread crumbs; *
who can stand against the cold of the Lord?**

18 God's word is sent **forth** and melts them; *
God's stormwinds blow, and the **waters** flow.

19 **God's word is declared to Jacob, *
God's statutes and judgments to Israel.**

20 **The Lord has not done so to any other nation; *
to them God's judgments have not been revealed. Hallelujah! R**

and you waters **above** the heavens.

5 Let them praise the name **of** the Lord, *
who commanded, and they **were** created.

6 The Lord made them stand fast for**ever** and ever *
and gave them a law which shall not **pass** away. **R**

7 Praise the Lord **from** the earth, *
you sea-monsters **and** all deeps;

8 **fire and hail, snow and fog,** *
tempestuous wind, obeying God's will;
