Joseph: Message to Pharaoh

Genesis 41:1-43; 45:4-11



In class today we learned about one of

God's messengers, Joseph. We learned how Joseph interpreted two of the pharaoh's strange dreams, explaining what God was going to do. Joseph was able to interpret dreams because it was an ability he had. We celebrated the different abilities and interests of those in the class. We also imagined together what dreams we have and ways we hope God will continue to work in our world today as we seek to be messengers.

Talk with your child about . . .

Clip coupons from the newspaper and take note of special deals to really stretch your dollar! Together, create a shopping list and head to the store. Before delivering your donations, say a prayer together, thanking God for the gift of food and for allowing you to be a part of helping others.
