) of Original Jurisdiction

In correspondence, Thomas B. Hoover requested that the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission assume original jurisdiction in a matter originating on May 22, 1990. The reason alleged for the request was that more than ninety days had elapsed without the Presbytery of Charlotte taking action and more than ninety days had elapsed without the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic responding to his request for it to assume original jurisdiction.

This Commission considered the material submitted by Mr. Hoover identifying May 22, 1990 as an original date. The Commission determined that no significant information was presented to warrant setting aside its order of May 10, 1991. The May 10, 1991, order stated that no matters arising from events taking place prior to March 15, 1991, would be considered by the Commission because the Commission had determined that all such matters had already been finally adjudicated.

Order

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED this 17th day of May, 1992, that the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission not assume original jurisdiction.
