## PRESBYTERY OF CHARLOTTE Respondent

In accordance with the decision of the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission in cases 206-9, 206-10, and 206-11, a complaint filed by Thomas B. Hoover against the Presbytery of Charlotte received by the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic on February 10, 1994, was referred to the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission.

The Executive Committee of the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission reviewed the complaint and recommended to the full permanent judicial commission that the complaint be dismissed for failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted.

Complaint Item No. 1 deals with cases already adjudicated and not addressable in this manner. Complaint Item No. 2 deals with the appointment of committee of counsel. Lashley's previous service on a special disciplinary committee does not preclude his service on the presbytery's committee of counsel. Complaint Item No. 3 is the result of proceedings voluntarily initiated by Hoover in requesting vindication. Since charges were not filed, in accordance with D-7.0500a, the special disciplinary committee's report concluded the matter.

It is therefore ordered that this case be dismissed.
